

DON'T TELL ME WHAT TO DO...


We've all been in that spot where someone has told us what we need to do. Sometimes it's a parent and other times it's a boss. Or it might even be a friend who knows what's best for us. And yet, when we're told what we must do, our reaction and our inclination to comply is generally less than enthusiastic. Our self-reliant and self-directive nature just doesn't like to be told what to do. So, how do we as Christians, who have the Truth, and desire others to know it too, share that Truth in ways it will be heard?

The old adage, "Do as I say, not as I do" reminds us that too often our actions and our example don't match up with the words that flow from our mouths. As parents this discrepancy is troubling as we seek to lead our children in the path they should go. As Christians, it can often be just as troubling. There's no denying that our sinful nature causes our actions to fail to line up with our words on a regular basis. And yet, we are called to, "Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God" (Ephesians 5:1-2). It is certainly a tall order to be imitators of God, and yet our example is what others see and is what speaks most loudly to those who are outside the church. That example is only possible when we walk as forgiven children of God, reveling in the blessings our God has given to us.

And it's in that walk as forgiven children that our example can be a beacon to those who may not hear our words, but just might follow our example. How much more effective is the example of forgiving our neighbor when they have harmed us, than preaching to them about forgiveness? How much more will someone know our joy in the Lord when we express that joy in a work of care or service? And how much more likely will someone be to share in the joy of Christ's bride, the church, when we sincerely invite them to join us instead of just telling them how important it is? I will always be happy to consider a sincere invitation to a place or an event that someone is excited to be at. Which is why I often finish that phrase, "Don't tell me what to do..." with the words "but invite me to do it with you!" As imitators of God, we are constantly inviting others to share in the joy and the peace of knowing our savior, Jesus Christ.

Confirmation & Home Instruction


As we begin confirmation classes again this month, after a year without this instruction for our young people, we will again be considering what it means to be instructed in the Scriptures, walk in the ways of the Lord, live a life of faith, and utilize the catechism. The article below, although geared toward children, is a great reminder to all of us of the treasure that we have in Luther's Small and Large Catechisms, which we use for instruction in the faith. Next to the Holy Scriptures themselves, the Small Catechism is the best teaching tool that we have and was designed to be used in the home by parents to teach their children the faith. If you're looking for some ways to incorporate devotions, Scripture reading, and the catechism into your daily or weekly routines at home, just ask pastor. He'd be more than happy to help you get started with these important activities.

What is a "catechism"?

A catechism (pronounced KAT-eh-kizm) is a book of instruction usually written in question and answer form. The word "catechism" comes from the Greek word *katekhein*, which means "to instruct." A catechism teaches the basics of the Christian faith.



Why do we need catechisms?



While visiting local churches, Martin Luther found many pastors and their church members were unaware of the true teachings of the Bible. Because of this, the people were living immoral lives. Martin Luther wrote the catechisms to instruct people in the basics of the Christian faith, that they might know Christ and His forgiveness and live accordingly. We still use Luther's Large and Small Catechisms so that we never forget those things that are necessary for faith in Christ.



Parents: Consider these words from Luther: "I, too, am a theologian who has attained a fairly good practical knowledge and experience of Holy Scriptures through various dangers. But I do not so glory in this gift as not to join my children daily in prayerfully reciting the Catechism. ... For God gave the Word that we should impress it on ourselves. ... Without this practice our souls become rusty, as it were, and we lose our-selves." (Plass, Ewald M., What Luther Says vol. 1 [St. Louis: Concordia, 1986], 125–26).
